She has recently been influential in the formation of two new non-profit associations: the New Jersey Licensed Site Remediation Professionals Association (LSRPA) and the Brownfield Coalition of the Northeast.

In November, Ms. Boyle was recognized as the 2010 Touchstone Award recipient by the Greater Philadelphia Chapter of SWEP, which recognizes and honors outstanding women who have made or are making a significant contribution to the environmental field.

In addition to authoring numerous articles on the subject of brownfield remediation and environmental sustainability, Boyle served as adjunct faculty/lecturer at New Jersey Institute of Technology where she and a team of practitioners created and taught one of the nation's first graduate courses in the science of brownfields. She is also a frequent lecturer at Rutgers University and the New Jersey Institute

for Continuing Legal Education. Previously, she has lectured at Princeton University, Cornell University, Queen's College in Belfast, Ireland, and Southampton University. Boyle was honored with the Freedom Bell 2005 from Project Freedom for spearheading the approval of 54 units of barrier-free housing. She also received the State of New Jersey Public Service Recognition for Teamwork/Partnership Achievement and Career Mentoring.
